

TUITION and REGISTRATION

- Tuition rate is \$300 per week.
- Registration begins on 2/25/19, and is first-come, first-serve
- A \$100 *per week* deposit is required at the time of registration and is nonrefundable.
- The remaining balance for summer is due by 5/8/19.

All activities are included in the cost of the program. For a refund of tuition (less the nonrefundable deposit), written requests to withdraw from all or part of the program must be submitted by 5/8/19. **No refunds will be given after 5/8/19.**

Siblings of LSA students **CAN** be enrolled in the LSA Summer Program as long as they are between the ages of 5 and 12 at the time of attendance. This includes incoming Kindergartners. Students not currently enrolled at LSA are required to complete the LSA registration packet prior to attendance.

PLEASE NOTE: Activities/Fieldtrips/Schedule in general are subject to change. We will make every effort to notify you of changes in advance.
